### The call

- Is part of the Restart and Transition Plan of the Federal Government: boost emergence of promising RI within Federal Research Institutions
- Seeks to complement previous and ongoing funding schemes
- ✓ BRAIN-be e.g. Axis 6: management of collections & BRAIN-be 2.0 (Pillar 2 Heritage Science)
- ✓ FED-tWIN Research profiles building expertise on the development and implementation of RI
- ✓ 2018 Specific call 4,3M€ for the upgrading federal components to meet requirements for subsequent integration into 5 ESFRIs. Funding stops in 2022.
- ✓ ESFRI-FED [2021-2026] 3 biennial calls with a total of 9M€ to strengthen the integration of federal components in ESFRI RI which are in implementation or operation phase.



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The call aims to turn **research products** from previous development **into research infrastructures** 

The proposals are therefore considered as 'RI in the making', nascent, infancy or embryonic phases or emerging RI with:

- ✓ A strong development component (≠ research project )
- ✓ Tangible expected to serve multiple (types of) users [scientists, policy makers or society]



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How will the services provided as outcome of this project be supported after the project ends?

INFRA-FED is an **impulse action call**. Limited duration of projects (mid 2023-end 2026) It is **not** framed in a **long-term support programme**.

Applicants are expected to explore options to make the provided services sustainable, i.e. by showing...

- ✓ A prominent role the new RI will have in the research strategy of the Institution.
- ✓ A provision of in-kind-contribution or other stable sources of funding
- ✓ Letter(s) of support
- ✓ The payment of provided services by the users
- **√** ...



### WHAT IS A RESEARCH INFRASTRUCTURE?

Are Informatic Infrastructures considered as R.I.?

Do infrastructures include models, datasets, population cohorts?

Research infrastructures (RI) are **facilities**, **resources** and **related services** used by research communities to conduct research and stimulate innovation. Where appropriate, they may be used beyond research, for example for education or public services.

### They include

- ✓ major scientific equipment or sets of instruments
- ✓ knowledge resources such as collections, archives, or structures for scientific information
- e-infrastructures such as data warehouses, computing systems and communication networks;
   software and software development; webservices; data(sets) and population cohorts.
- ✓ any other infrastructure of a unique nature, essential for achieving excellence in research and innovation.



### WHICH RESEARCH INFRASTRUCTURES ARE ELIGIBLE FOR THIS CALL?

Is the call intended to create entirely new infrastructures, or also to support physical equipment or growth of existing infrastructure?

Is it allowed that the project proposal connects with and builds further on BELSPO projects that are currently implemented or will start soon?

Are existing infrastructures envisioning new services/products eligible?

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### More concretely:

- ✓ ESFRI and non-ESFRI Research Infrastructures
- ✓ Based on existing building blocks issued from previous, ongoing developments or expertise within the Federal Research Institutes
- ✓ RI flagging societal, scientific or political priorities
- ✓ Likely to play **key**/unique **role (inter)nationally**; have **potential to be anchored in international/EU** RI or be used by EU/International ( scientific) initiatives
- √ 'Nice to have' excluded



### WHAT IS THE AIM OF THE CALL?

Is the call intended to create entirely new infrastructures, or also to support physical equipment or growth of existing infrastructure?

To which extent needs a proposal be linked at or embedded in ongoing activities?

The call aims to stimulate the **development**, **upgrade** and **deployment** of emerging **infrastructures** held by Federal Research Institutes with an **impactful potential** for the (inter)national scientific community and/or society.

Thanks to development, the proposal needs to address **actions** that go **beyond catching up on an essential RI service** that the applying federal research institute is supposed to offer.

It must show improvement of RI services or development of new services based on specific assets or expertise present within the institution.

In case the proposal is not yet linked or embedded in ongoing (inter)national activities, this must be the target.



### WHAT IS THE AIM OF THE CALL?

Can the proposal be part of long-term planning? Should the proposals be multidisciplinary?

✓ Requires tangible outcome by the end of the project timespan. This can be part of a long-term planning strategy of a Federal Research Institute. (Outcome of project = milestone in long-term planning).

✓ Encourages proposals to **deliver responsive solutions** to broad and **urgent societal challenges**. Only robust and strategic **collaborative approach,** bringing together multiple expertise ( not necessary disciplines) is likely to contribute meeting those challenges in agile way.




### WHAT IS THE ELIGIBILITY IN TERMS OF PARTNERSHIP?

Does the call target only FSI? May only FSI benefit/create/manage products related to the R.I.? Do proposals require having more than one partner?

Are Belgian university partners available for funding?

Is it possible to have a consortium with an FSI and non-federal institutions where the non-federal institutions take the lead?

Can the same FSI introduced 2 different projects (with 2 different topics)?



- ✓ Only Federal Research Institutions eligible to introduce and coordinate a project (FRI list in Annex 1 of Information File)
- ✓ They may choose to do with or without partners and/or subcontractors.

Partners financed by the project will be **Belgian**, **public and conduct Research**. Other partners (i.e. (inter)national partners) may partake in the project as non-funded partners, contributing with cash or in-kind. Subcontracting is accepted as stated in the budget rules.



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
Can the same FSI introduced 2 different projects (with 2 different topics)?

- ✓ The call targets Federal Research Institutes (not only FSI)
- ✓ Proposals may have more than 1 partner institution
- ✓ Belgian universities and public federated research centres are also eligible as subcontractors.
- ✓ The same FRI may introduce more than one project. However, beware that the Panel criteria refers to the coverage in terms of domains and types of infrastructure.



### DOES PROPOSAL SELECTION TAKE PLACE ALREADY DURING SUBMISSION?

What is/are the mandatory language(s) for submission? EN and/or FR+NL? Will the main selection be at the level of the EoI or at the Full proposal? Will only selected projects be invited to submit a Full proposal?



The evaluation and selection of proposals takes place after the Full Proposal submission.


However, BELSPO conducts **eligibility checks (administrative)** to ensure proposals comply in terms of:

- ✓ The participating institutions
- ✓ The Research Infrastructures foreseen
- ✓ The possible experts
- ✓ The language of the proposals (only English)



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- ✓ No evaluation of EoIs = there is no selection of EoIs
- ✓ EoIs having passed the eligibility check will be allowed to go forward
- ✓ Only Full proposals having passed the eligibility check will be evaluated.

### WHAT IS THE PROPOSAL'S BUDGET AND WHAT DOES IT COVER?

Is the total budget of the call divided in equal parts per project or do we need to estimate a budget for our submitted project? How many projects will be accepted for funding?

What are the maximum, minimum and typical budget/proposal?

Can the obtained budget be freely and equally used for the salary, purchasing scientific material, consultancy...?

What is the max % of the budget of the project that can go into subcontracting?

The total budget for this call is 11,704M€, and there is not a fixed number of projects to be accepted for funding; the 11,704M€ will be exhausted according to the quality and cost-effectiveness of the proposals in view of its objectives. Each proposal must estimate their own budget.

The maximum requested budget per project is 1M€, distributed into Staff, Overheads, Operating costs, Equipment and Subcontracting, according to the Budget Rules (see Information File and <u>Budget Table</u>). There is NO minimum budget, and no 'typical budget'; all projects must explain their budget and demonstrate 'value for money'.

Subcontracting is allowed to max. 25% of the budget of the partner who lists it.



### WHAT IS THE PROPOSAL'S BUDGET AND WHAT DOES IT COVER?

Is there a the budget for 'maintaining' the services/products after the project has ended?

There is no budget foreseen to maintain the services/products. Proposals **need to demonstrate the sustainability** of the project by providing a (light, 5-year) **business plan which includes:** 

- ✓ General management and operation of the RI
- ✓ KPIs for the monitoring of the performance of the services delivered by the project (access, data management, feed-back from stakeholders).
- Embedding of the services in international initiatives.
- ✓ Estimated running costs of the RI
- ✓ In-kind contribution(s) of the partner institution and how it is likely to change over time.
- ✓ External stable sources of (co-)funding, including users' fees.
- ✓ Estimated operation time, network activity plan.
- ✓ Suitability model (location of the RI)



### WHICH ARE THE STEPS IN THE EVALUATION PROCEDURE?

Does the evaluation procedure occur in one step or are there some pre-selection steps (e.g. eligibility check)? Is the evaluation of the proposals done by national reviewers, or international?

The evaluation of the Full proposals takes place in 2 steps:

✓ Remote individual evaluation (3 international experts / proposal)
With skills and expertise in the development and use of RI in the domain of the proposal

There will be NO REBUTTAL phase in the Evaluation.



✓ (Physical) panel evaluation (approx. 6 national and international experts).

Including experts familiar with RI landscape at the national, EU, global scale

How are the criteria evaluated? How is the score calculated? Are all the criteria equal in the evaluation procedure? Which elements are relevant to improve the score? How strong does 'Impact of the project' count in the total score?

Full proposals are evaluated against a set of 3 main criteria, divided into sub-criteria (according to an Evaluation Matrix. Evaluators must adhere to the statements in the Matrix in order to score the proposals and provide comments justifying their choice.

- ✓ Quality and relevance of the proposal and potential for international anchoring
- ✓ Quality and efficiency of the implementation (including budget)
- ✓ Impact, added value and sustainability
