







First conference of the Belgian Homelessness Research Network, 24 March 2022

Homelessness is on the rise in Belgium and Europe. Research on the national and international level is needed to improve the lives of people experiencing homelessness through better use of data and evidence. In the BRAIN-project **TRAHOME**, three research groups have joined forces: LUCAS KU Leuven, Social Work and Social Pedagogy UGent and CIRTES of the UCL. TRAHOME is a four-year research project on the trajectories of homeless persons based on a mixed methods research approach.

Since homelessness research is also taking place in diverse research groups across the country and provides complexities, the TRAHOME team would like to organize an open-minded exchange between researchers dealing with homelessness, and associated historical and societal issues and processes leading to homelessness, in the Belgian welfare state.

We are therefore pleased to announce the first conference of the **Belgian Homelessness Research Network** in Brussels. The aim of the network is to strengthen and cross-fertilize the knowledge and cooperation between different researchers, and to create an inspiring network of early stage researchers and PhD students.

Keynote speakers

Prof. dr. Paula Mayock is an Assistant Professor at the School of Social Work and Social Policy, Trinity College in Dublin. Mayock's research focuses primarily on the lives and experiences of marginalised youth, covering areas including homelessness, drug use and drug problems, risk behaviour, sexuality, and mental health. In recent studies, Mayock investigates youth homelessness and women's homelessness.

Prof. dr. Koen Hermans is an Assistant Professor Social Work and Social Policy. He is also a project leader at LUCAS, Centre for Care Research and Consultancy at KU Leuven, where he executes practice- and policy-oriented research on homelessness, social exclusion, poverty and well-being.

Prof. dr. Griet Roets is an Associate Professor of Social Work at the Department of Social Work and Social Pedagogy at Ghent University, and one of the founders of the interdisciplinary and transdisciplinary research consortium of the Urban Academy.

Prof. dr. Martin Wagener is an Assistant Professor in Sociology of work and social policy at the Labour Science School and the Open Faculty for Economic and Social Policy (Fopes) and affiliated researcher at the CIRTES (Centre for interdisciplinary research on Work, State and Society) at UCLouvain.
